Yamaha CD-S1000

Linn Klimax Components

We've seen a wealth of splendid high-end kit this year, from super yachts to super homes to super audio visual equipment, but Linn's Klimax range of high-end hi-fi components combines all the best upmarket virtues of effortless world-class performance, distinctive design, ease of use, immaculate build quality, superb service from the local agents and an all-encompassing warm pride of ownership. Yes, the price tags are lofty, but at this level that's part of the appeal — you simply don't get a Rolls-Royce for Mini money. Reviewed in *Tone 67*, page 37.

LINN KLIMAX LOUDSPEAKERS

It was hard to ignore the beautiful Klimax floorstanders lurking in one of Linn NZ's listening rooms, and I wouldn't leave without a quick listen to these high-end (\$75,000) statements. With the top-of-the-range Klimax DS as the source (\$29,995) and a Klimax Kontrol preamp (\$21,995) feeding the 1750 watts of active amplification built into each gorgeous speaker, the results were awesome.

The lovely Shelby Lynne's equally lovely voice on her Just a Little Lovin' album purred into the room sounding very little like hi-fi and a lot like heaven. The stunning presentation left all five of the listeners lost for words. If I've heard levels of detail, micro-dynamics, space, a sense of ease and a practically perfect balance quite like this before, I simply don't remember it. This delicious experience absolutely has to be repeated and we'll be back for a much longer listen in the near future. And for any musically orientated CEOs or lottery winners reading this, a listening session should be a priority.
